Terms and Conditions

Riparian fencing:

- This program is for exclusion fencing, intended for the exclusion of livestock from waterways. It does not cover peripheral fencing. Riparian fencing must be a minimum distance of 30 feet back from the waterway.
- The Riparian fencing program cost-share will be 75% SRRCD, 25% landowner with a maximum SRRCD contribution of \$1000.00.

Cattle crossing:

- The creation of cattle crossing areas where cattle or machinery may cross at a specified location in order to reduce stream-bank degradation and erosion on intermittent and smaller waterways.
- The Cattle crossing program cost-share will be 75% SRRCD, 25% landowner with a maximum SRRCD contribution of \$1000.00.

Off-site watering:

- This program provides funding for producers who have fenced off natural water courses to purchase pumping equipment for watering livestock.
- The Off-site watering program cost-share will be 75% SRRCD for a total project cost of \$5000 or under; from \$5000 to \$10,000 total project cost, SRRCD cost-share will be 50%.

Grass / Treed buffer establishment:

- To enhance the stability of the waterway shoreline areas, and reduce further soil loss and erosion, the SRRCD will assist with establishing a grass and/or treed buffer area.
- The SRRCD will work with partner organizations to provide technical and financial assistance with a maximum contribution of \$1000 to cover the seed/tree costs of establishing an effective buffer area.

General Information:

The annual projects resulting from this program are subject to available annual funding. The SRRCD will determine application priorities in consultation with sub-district members and Board staff. All projects must be approved by the SRRCD Board prior to construction and/or installation.

The Landowner is to design the project in cooperation with the SRRCD staff and/or other partner organizations (MAFRI, PFRA, or MHHC). The Landowner will perform necessary maintenance following the completion of the project and agrees to leave the project in place for a minimum of 10 years. After 10 years, all materials purchased and/or installed will become the property of the landowner.
